AWARDS MORE THAN \$61 MILLION TO COMMUNITIES ACROSS CALIFORNIA**

Funding is provided to smaller and rural communities that often lack access to other types of financial resources.

SACRAMENTO – Cities and counties across California will soon receive funding to help tackle a wide variety of community and economic development activities, thanks to a federal program administered by the California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD).

A total of \$61.5 million in federal Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding will be awarded to 19 counties across the state. Awards will help fund all kinds of community enhancements, including, single family or multifamily home rehabilitation, homeownership assistance, senior services, public water improvements, programs for abused spouses, and more.

“The CDBG program is a flexible instrument that allows us to help smaller cities and counties create jobs, homes, services, and businesses,” said Ben Metcalf, Director of HCD. “HCD is proud to award these funds to communities that have the need and desire to make critical improvements, but often lack the necessary resources to turn their plans into reality.”

The CDBG program is an important tool for helping local governments turn around serious challenges facing their communities—from safe, stable, affordable homes, to creating jobs through the expansion and retention of local businesses, to health and safety improvement projects like senior daycare facilities, fire stations, and medical clinics.

The annual CDBG appropriation is allocated between states and local jurisdictions known as "non-entitlement" or "entitlement" communities. Entitlement communities are typically metropolitan cities with populations of at least 50,000, and qualified urban counties with a population of 200,000 or more. They receive their grants directly from the federal government. Non-entitlement communities are typically smaller rural cities and counties.

HCD administers the non-entitlement CDBG program for local community development activities such as affordable housing, anti-poverty programs, and infrastructure development. These activities improve the lives of lower-income individuals and families through the creation and expansion of community and economic development opportunities.
