CDBG Program Updates

- 2023 CDBG NOFA
 - Application closed December 29, 2023 for the Over-the-counter (OTC) waitlisted projects



- We received 7 applications
- We conditionally awarded 6 applications
- 2023 CDBG NOFA Amendment #1
 - · Application closed March 15, 2024 for new projects when funds were exhausted
 - · We received 12 applications
 - Conditional award letters were sent May 24, 2024

CDBG Income Limits

- Income limits have been released and are effective 5/1/24.
- HCD has released the limits in Department format: <u>income-limits-cdbg-2024.pdf</u> (ca.gov)
- Income limits are identified by the following brackets:

Extremely Low Income – Up to 30% of AMI

Low Income – Up to 50% of AMI

Moderate Income – Up to 80% of AMI

 Grantees must use these new income limits when determining eligibility for CDBG programs.

Office Hours Q&A Recap – May 15, 2024 Session

Question: Can multiple jurisdictions co-apply for a single competitive program? Would this apply as 1 competitive app for each of the co-applicants, or would only a 'lead applicant' incur it?

<u>Answer:</u> Jurisdictions may co-apply for CDBG funds, including competitive. The application would count against the lead applicant's application limit. The application would be subject to the maximum funding request of the application type.

Question: I have been asked by management about the closeout of older CDBG grants. We are running out of storage space and are wondering if we need to purchase another sea train to house all of the files. Is there any word on closeouts of older grants?

<u>Answer:</u> Before we can close grants with our Grantees, we will need to close out grants with HUD. HCD is in communication with HUD about closing out older grants. It's also become a priority for HUD. Recently, HUD released a memo detailing a process for bulk closeouts of CDBG grants. We are working with HUD on this new process.

Question: Can you let us know the latest program year that has been closed by HUD or a list of them that haven't been closed?

<u>Answer:</u> It's been a very long time, but we are having continuous conversations with HUD on closing out old grants. The bulk closeout process from HUD will hopefully allow us to close many years of grants at one time.

Question: When will 2024 CDBG income limits be published?

Question: Would you please post the text from the slide explaining what types and the number of applications that will be accepted in the upcoming NOFA?



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<u>Answer:</u> Application maximums can be found in HCD's 2024-2025 Annual Action Plan 2024 Application Maximums:

1 OTC Project + 1 OTC Program + 1 Competitive -OR-

1 OTC Project + 2 Competitive -OR-

1 OTC Program + 2 Competitive.

Note: 2 OTC Project, 2 OTC Program, or 3 Competitive applications are **NOT** allowed.

Question: When will you be notifying applicants that submitted applications for the CDBG-CV Allocation of Remaining Funds?

Answer: Grant Administrators will be reaching out via e-mail next week with an update on your request.

Question: Do you have any information on implementation of the changes to CDBG ED programs? Will they be applicable to 2024 grants?

<u>Answer:</u> HUD proposed CDBG rule changes on January 10, 2024 (89 FR 1746). Many of these rules were proposed to make Economic Development activities easier for grantees. These rules are still in the rulemaking process and are not yet effective.

Question: Are there resources (maybe from funded applications) on how to structure successful code enforcement programs? Trying to understand how to structure a possible application to ensure that it would be competitive and compliant.
